We will meet you at Auckland Airport off flight ____ at _____. You will then transfer to your hotel in central Auckland (30 minutes).

Day 2: Auckland

Waiheke Island Day Trip.

At 9:30am you will walk the short distance to the Auckland ferry terminal and take a trip across Auckland harbour to Waiheke Island (30 minutes). You will be met by a driver and transfer to Cable Bay followed by Stonyridge for wine tasting. At 12:45pm your driver will transfer you to Poderi Crisci for a 1:00pm “Long Lunch”. Once you have finished lunch your driver will meet you and transfer you to Matiatia Wharf for the ferry ride to Auckland. Alternatively, you can return to Auckland at your leisure.

see evidence of its fiery birth in the geysers, steaming craters and boiling mud pools.

Hawke's Bay

And it's a place where you can walk the forest trails of the Ruahine and Kaweka Forest Parks or the glorious beaches that stretch along the coast.

Golf Courses

Royal Auckland & Grange (Auckland)

The merging of New Zealand's neighbouring Royal Auckland and Grange Golf Club's was formalised in 2015, when members of the two clubs voted to join forces and consolidate their courses into one new 27-hole Nicklaus Design facility. Royal Auckland's history dates back as far as 1894, and The Grange to 1924. The value of their surplus land enabled the new club to pursue what from the outside seemed a rather ambitious project, that is to use a modern Nicklaus Design as a means of establishing this new entity as Auckland's premier private club facility. At a cost exceeding \$60 million, the newly merged club was able to build a contemporary Andrew Patterson designed clubhouse and to stage the opening of its three nines between 2019 and 2021. The 27 holes at Royal Auckland and Grange are spread almost equally across the two founding club properties, with the nines known as Grange, Tamaki and Middlemore. The Middlemore holes include the area closest to the former Royal Auckland clubhouse.

Te Arai – South Course (Mangawhai)

Te Arai Links will encompass two pure links golf courses. The South Course design is by world renowned golf architects Coore & Crenshaw and is currently under construction. The North Course is designed by Tom Doak, whose skill and craftsmanship has been integral to the success of Tara Iti Golf Club, North of Te Arai Links. The North Course will begin construction in the third quarter of 2021. Te Arai Links is golf as it was destined to be. Te Arai which is just over an hour drive North of Auckland, is a place that is rich in cultural history and showcases extraordinary coastal beauty – think exposed sand, coupled with firm and fast fescue turf. Golfers will walk and marvel at the beauty of natural landscape and will feel the pull to return again and again to share this gem with family and friends. See and hear the sound of the waves crashing and smell the salt in the air as you traverse the course and enjoy all the special details and hospitality on offer.

Te Arai North (Near Mangawhai)

Opening October 2023.

Course designer Tom Doak states:

"The North Course starts and finishes on the ocean, but for me the unique character of the course will be found inland. The green of the par-4 5th hole, and the next tee, sit high on a ridge adjacent to an ancient Māori Pa, or hill fortress, built from the largest dune on the property, while the 4th, 6th, 7th and 9th greens sit in a shared bowl amongst the dunes."

Possibly the most dramatic holes on the course will be the 11th and 13th. The former is a long par-5 with an elevated green and a 'whirlpool' hazard to the right, some seven meters below the green. The 13th is a long par-4 with its green at the edge of a huge natural bunker, so that second shots have to be played over the sand or safely around to the left. It's a hole very reminiscent of Pine Valley in New Jersey, and indeed so is much of the inland terrain at Te Arai. It is odd having to apologize for a golf course that 'only' features the ocean for seven of the 18 holes, but that is how spoiled golfers have become by the best of New Zealand's modern golf courses. The North Course promises to be near the head of the class.

Kauri Cliffs (Bay of Islands)

Kauri Cliffs was designed and built by David Harman of Golf Course Consultants, Orlando, Florida. The par 72 championship golf course measures 7,119 yards/6,510 metres and offers five sets of tees to challenge every skill level. Fifteen holes view the Pacific Ocean, six of which are played alongside cliffs which plunge to the sea. The beautiful inland holes wind through marsh, forest and farmland. The golf complex includes a world-class practice range, putting and chipping greens, a well-stocked golf shop and ladies' and mens' locker rooms.

The Kinloch Club (Taupo)

The first Jack Nicklaus Signature Golf Course to be built in New Zealand has been created around the unique natural features of the site rather than transforming the landscape to meet a uniform golf course design. The course fits the landscape with ease, and the backdrop of Lake Taupo provides a magnificent setting. Jack Nicklaus on the Kinloch golf course development: "The Kinloch site has the views and all the elevation that you need for a great golf course. It will be a very special and enjoyable golf course."

Wairakei Golf & Sanctuary (Taupo)

The Wairakei Golf & Sanctuary is set midway between Auckland and Wellington, in the heart of the spectacular scenery of the Lake Taupo region. Designed by Commander John Harris, Michael Wolveridge and Peter Thomson with the aim of producing New Zealand's first internationally recognised golf course, there is little doubt that this trio exceeded all expectations. The end result is a course that sprawls over 450 acres of natural countryside. This coupled with the 6429 metres from the championship tees and 108 large well placed bunkers has led Wairakei to receive worldwide acclaim.

Cape Kidnappers (Hawke's Bay)

The American designer of Cape Kidnappers, Tom Doak, who is also well known for his prize-winning courses in the US, has said that, 'If Cape Kidnappers were a book it would be an epic. Enjoy your game and enjoy the setting (because) you may never play golf somewhere like this again'. Like Kauri Cliffs, Cape Kidnappers plays above the ocean, atop dramatic cliffs, but unlike Kauri Cliffs, where the shape of the land dictates play along the shoreline, this course runs to and from the edge. Cape Kidnappers is built on a ridge-and-valley landscape with spectacular sea views.

Jack's Point (Queenstown)

Set within a 3,000 acre nature preserve on the shores of Lake Wakatipu, Jacks Point has sweeping lake and alpine vistas with a 360-degree mountainscape. The course is bounded by the Remarkables mountain range and Lake Wakatipu. It traverses through wetland to the lake edge encountering steep bluffs, indigenous vegetation and wildlife and is designed to work with nature, not against it. The fairways have been designed with minimal excavation and careful plantings to complement the natural environment.

The Hills (Queenstown)

The Hills was designed by Darby Partners and opened in 2007 to host the New Zealand Open. This championship layout provides a serious challenge for accomplished golf players while thoughtful and considerate design means that the golf course is equally enjoyable for golfers of all abilities. Set over 500 acres of land across a glacial valley, The Hills is home to an incredible array of flora including native brown top grasses and wild native mountain tussocks. Sculptures crafted by New Zealand artists compliment the natural beauty of the course's lakes, waterways and wetland areas. Winter snow and frost conditions provide the ideal climate for the finest grasses suited to the modern-day game of golf. The course is the current home of the New Zealand Open.

Accommodation

Park Hyatt, Auckland (5 star hotel)

Park Hyatt Auckland is perfectly located on the water's edge and will offer expansive views across Wynyard Quarter's Lighter Basin and out to the Waitematā Harbour. The hotel will have 195 guestrooms, four restaurants and bars, versatile and boutique event spaces, a day spa, a 25-metre infinity pool, and a full fitness center.

Te Arai Resort (5 star golf resort)

Positioned alongside a pristine New Zealand coastline, Te Arai Links promises to be a world class golf destination. Boasting two pure links golf courses designed by Tom Doak and the other by Bill Coore & Ben Crenshaw. Te Arai Links is a scenic 90-minute drive from the Auckland CBD, or 25 minutes by helicopter. While only a short trip north of New Zealand's largest city, you'll find yourself in another world - surrounded by trees, sand dunes and coastal views over one of the country's most stunning, white sand, surf beaches. The Suites at Te Arai Links are luxurious, offering 45m² (484sf) of beautifully appointed space with contemporary details. The Suites overlook The South Course and in some instances provide views of the Pacific Ocean and islands beyond. Located just a short walk from the South Clubhouse, Pizza Barn and practice facilities, the Suites are located in the heart of the property. Architecturally designed by Studio John Irving, with interiors by Jenni Kayne, these well-proportioned rooms come in two layouts, one king size bed or two queen beds.

Kauri Cliffs Lodge, Bay of Islands (5 star luxury lodge)

Located on 6,000 acres near Matauri Bay, the luxurious The Lodge at Kauri Cliffs offers 180-degree ocean views, 3 private beaches, an 18-hole golf course and 2 tennis courts. Guests also enjoy an infinity pool with a spa pool, a fitness centre, a day spa and an onsite restaurant. Your stay at The Lodge includes breakfast, pre-dinner drinks with hors d'oeuvres and gourmet dinner. A complimentary in-room minibar is provided, with domestic beer - liquor/wines are available for an extra charge.

Huka Lodge, Taupo

Eichardt's Private Hotel , Queenstown (5 star hotel)

Playing Around New Zealand

In the summer of 2003, a passion for golf and travel prompted Will Owen to buy a small minibus and begin offering a daily golf service for visitors to Christchurch, New Zealand. Through hotel and online marketing this service became popular and he expanded the tours to include other destinations on the South Island. In 2004, he conducted his first multi-day tour for a golf group from Australia along with several self-drive itineraries for visiting golfers from across the globe. By the summer of 2005, Playing Around New Zealand was firmly established and Will began employing the services of first class guides to assist him in making his tour service truly nationwide.
