The Golf Courses

Christchurch GC (Shirley)

Christchurch Golf Club is rated as one of the best courses (known as Shirley) in New Zealand.

Excellent fairways, strategically placed bunkers, water hazards and beautiful greens. Course remodelled by the great Peter Thomson. The club has a fully stocked Pro Shop with hire clubs and motorised carts along with extensive practice facilities including permanent mats and undercover bays.



Clearwater Resort (Christchurch)

Clearwater Golf Club is located 20 minutes' drive from Christchurch city centre. Designed by Sir Bob Charles the course has played host to 8 NZ PGA Championships, 2 NZ Opens and 4 NZ Women's Opens. This course combines elements of links golf inspired by the great Scottish golf courses, with parklands golf, more reminiscent of Florida. Despite water coming into play on no less than 14 holes, this is a golf course that golfers of all abilities will enjoy. The onsite hotel, currently managed by Peppers, provides superb lakeside accommodation and fine dining options.

Millbrook Resort (Queenstown)

Designed by Sir Bob Charles and surrounded by the alpine backdrop of the Remarkables mountain range, the impeccably groomed fairways and greens of Millbrook provide an exhilarating experience. Situated 25 minutes' drive from Queenstown the course provides a challenge for golfers of all abilities and is considered to be one of the most impressive international golf arenas in the world. Millbrook is about to add 9 new holes, making 36 holes in total. These holes will boost Millbrook's reputation as one of New Zealand's best resort courses.





Jacks Point (Queenstown)

With a backdrop of 2300 vertical metres of the Remarkables mountain range and an armchair view of an outstanding lake panoramas, Jack's Point Golf course is one of the most visually spectacular in the world. As an 18 hole par 72 championship course it offers golfers an exciting challenge with five tee positions to choose from, providing all golfers an unforgettable golf experience. The course has been designed around the natural landscape, with minimal excavation. The course is built on the most spectacular of Jack's Point terrain. Designed in harmony with the natural environment, the course weaves through native

tussock grasslands, dramatic rock outcrops, steep bluffs and swathes of native bush to the edge of Lake Wakatipu. The presentation of the course is second to none, which makes Jack's Point one of the world's great golfing experiences.

Option:

The Hills

The Hills, opened in 2007, is set over 101 hectares (250 acres) of former deer farm on the outskirts of Arrowtown in Central Otago. The Mill race winds its way through the property and feeds the ten lakes and various ponds and waterways on the golf course. Trees, both native and exotic, are a feature of the course. The wetland area have been expanded, planted out with varieties of New Zealand flax, toetoe, the ubiquitous cabbage tree and wetland grasses and reeds. More than 50,000 red and silver tussock plants create a spectacular visual statement.



Winter snow and frost conditions provide the ideal climate to grow fine grasses preferred for modern day golf. The course is the current co-host of the New Zealand Open.
